Geographical scope:

Based on the job role innovation agent and the new innovation assessment model developed for ISO 5600x innovation management system assessment a framework for a task force has been created and signed so far by 34 experts from 22 countries.

Innovation assessors applying the ISO 5600x series innovation assessment method

An expert panel that reviews and manages the skills and training program for an innovation agent and an ISO 5600x innovation (benchmarking) assessor.

Summary/short description:

In the EU blueprint project FLAMENCO services for re-skilling the automotive and IT industry are established in cooperation with the Automotive Skills Alliance as the pact for skills partner for automotive in Europe. A task force is currently being set up to qualify innovation agents (as a job role) and provide innovation agents with a set of methods and tools. The EU project TIMS developed a set of training modules and an innovation assessment tool which has been packaged and used for the innovation agent services in the ASA.

There is a SPRINGER published white paper which describes the background of the innovation agent task force and provides an insight into the innovation assessment tool and services which are applied to support the implementation of innovation management systems. The paper also outlines the need for innovation and how the new ISO 56000 norm series for innovation management systems has been adapted for the need pf the ASA task force.




Figure 1: Innovation Agent Task Force Portfolio

Clarification of the scope of work in detail – what are sub-team activities: Sub-teams are developing materials which have commercial value, such as training material, and assessment tools. Those subgroups have the right to offer a license option for use to all members of the innovation agent task force. Task force members will have special conditions. Sub-team activities are:

- Developing training material
- Developing an exam system
- Configuring an assessment system

Methodology:

This task force is based on the following working approach:

1. Building a critical mass of innovation experts.

Based on 2 training events (8.5.2024, 12.6.2024) , one conference in Riga (16.5.2024) and the EuroSPI conference (4.-6.9.2024) innovation experts have been gathered and the new ISO 56000 materials, an assessment portal and the training materials have been exchanged and discussed

Also the workshops on 8.5.2624 and 12.6.2024 have been configured into the innovation agent MOOC in the ASA skills hub and the participants of the workshops accessed all new materials via this ASA infrastructure.

This networking to grow the group will continue.

2. Involving lead industry for best practice exchange.

The assessment portal for ISO 5600x has been used in trials by leading industry and feedback was given about how to improve the assessment approach. Under FLAMENCO a MBA thesis at TU Graz has been performed (2023 – Oct 2024) to elaborate the business model for the innovation agent task force.

1. Standard Agreement Establishment

First a set of innovation workshops and conferences took place (see point 1. under methodology section).

Then based on all discussions with all participating experts a standard innovation agent task force agreement has been set up.

This included a formal agreement for joining members which outlined (See the file: Innovation-Agent-Task-Force-Committee-Agreement-EN-v3.docx)

- §1 Scope of the Agreement
- §2 Duties of the ASA and the task force management team EuroSPI and ISCN
- §3 Duties of the Innovation Agent Task Force Committee Member
- §4 Effort and ASA Commercial Flows
- §5 Liability & Restrictions
- §6 Changes / Duration / Cancellation
- §7 Non Disclosure
- §8 Law

Any new member has to sign that agreement. So far 34 experts signed the agreement. The agreement template will remain as the standard template to be used.

2. Scope of Work and Objective Definition for the Task Force

Based on the discussions in the meetings with the experts, and based on the standard innovation agent task force agreement, a white paper has been written and published in the SPRINGER book series at the EuroSPI conference 2024.

- The objectives
- The approach
- The activities planned
- and with which infrastructure that will be achieved
- as well as first experiences from ISO 56000 assessments in leading industry

This white paper will be annually updated and presented annually at EuroSPI from 2024 onwards.

Based on the signed agreements (34 experts from 22 countries) and leading industry participating in ISO 56000 assessment trails and the project TRIREME that will further develop the materials after the FLAMENCO task fore set up, an innovation agent kick off meeting is organised.

Red: means that the materials is new and needs to be developed new.





Figure 2: Work Packages based on the portfolio in Fig.1 and status for the integration work

- Each mini-team will have its own online meetings and meet quarterly to report progress to all. The quarterly meetings are online.
- The communication is supported by a cloud, by using a joined ind frastructiure (ASA skills hub, EuroSPI academy, ISO 56000 assessment portal online) and meetings are done in MS Teams.
- Annually there is a gathering at the EuroSPI conference (https://conference.eurospi.net/index.php/en/) which can be attended onsite and online
- The overall management (see attended innovation agent task force agreement is by ISCN and EuroSPI).

Challenges and risks:

- The ISO 5600x innovation management standard series is brand new and some parts are still in publication. This means that the material will have to be updated along with the updates of the standard.
- To get fully recognised it will be critical to involve even more leading industry in the innovation assessment trials applying ISO 56000.
- The innovation agent task force focuses on the innovation agent skills and innovation assessor skills and in terms of the innovation assessor plans its own qualification schema. This means that it is not planned to share the innovation assessor qualification with an organisation like INTACS, an own assessor schema will be set up under the ASA umbrella. A liaison is later possible.
- It will be a challenge in 2025/2026 to apply for an ISO 330xx number for the innovation assessment model, an application to ISO is planned in cooperation with the ISO 56000 working group members.
- Note: Ressources are less risk, see the section financial support. Risks are rather related to communication risks with stakeholders (see above bullet points)

Results / Assesed Progress

The following results have been achieved so far:

- The innovation agent workshops have been performed and all materials published in the ASA innovation agent section of the ASA skills hub (https://learn.skills-framework.eu/enrol/index.php?id=38)
- Based on annual innovation workshop series at EuroSPI conference (https://conference.eurospi.net/index.php/en/workshop?id=53)
- An innovation agent task force white paper has been published in SPRINGER (https://link.springer.com/book/10.1007/978-3-031-71142-8) and attached InnoAgentTaskForce-White-Paper-SPRINGER-978-3-031-71142-8_10.pdf.
- Based on ISO 5600x Assessment System Infrastructure (https://iso56000.eurospi.net/innovation_bench/index.php) trial assessments hav been performed.
- An innovation agent task force agreement as basis for the collaboration has been developed and applied (See attached file Innovation-Agent-Task-Force-Committee-Agreement-EN-v3.doc)




Figure 5: Work packages grouped by phases

- Set up as a task force in the EU Project FLAMENCO. The figure 5 above shows the current members that signed the agreement.
- The kick off takes place in Oct/Nov 2024 and the expert panel and project TRIREME partners are committed to continue with this work.

Resources:

The established expert panel is committed to invest each 6 days effort per year, according, makes currently an expert bufget of $34 \times 6 = 204$ man days volunteer work by workd wide recognised innovation experts per year.

In addition it was agreed that in the TRIREME Bluering the full innovation services will be developed (see section activities) and resources can be used in the time span 2024 – 2028.

In addition leading European industry already participates (they cover their own staff cost) in the ISO 56000 assessment trials which makes an additional volunteer work budget of significant size.


Replication and Sustainability:

The task force is based on signed agreements and industry trial partmers, plus an EU project that will continue to develop the service.

The different work packages have been grouped into work phases which can be used as a framework for an operational work plan.

Figure 4: Draft phase plan of the innovation agent task force

The role of ASA has been defined by the innovation agent task firce agreement and included in the task firce kick off material.

The innovation agent task firce agreement includes the following:

- ASA promotes the innovation agent task force to the automotive industry in Europe. The innovation agent portfolio contains: skill set, training materials, innovation assessment portal, and related services like innovation assessments.
- ASA acts as a management board that decides in case of conflict and reviews annually the work of the task force committee.
- ASA and the management team organise quarterly meetings and distributes status reports to all innovation agent task force members.
- ASA ensures that information about actual skill set is available to all ASA members.
- ASA receives an annually updated skills set, and information about innovation assessment portal and training sets updates.
- ASA promotes the innovation agent task force on the ASA web site and in flyers.
- ASA grants the innovation agent task force committee members the right to use the ASA logo in their brochures, solely for the purpose to promote the innovation agent task force.
